States Act to Save Energy, Ease Bills

At least a dozen states are imposing, or considering, new energy-efficiency requirements that will help drive down monthly utility bills but will force many consumers to pay more for household electrical items. The requirements demand lower power usage from energy-hungry items such as *cell-phone power cords*, and certain light bulbs. The estimated extra cost of the energy-efficient versions ranges from 50 cents for a light bulb to \$580 for a pool pump. Most small items will cost a few extra dollars. But some floor lamps could cost \$20 more, and ceiling fans up to \$40 more.


